


Complaints

Total complaints received from **January 21 – February 20, 2008** numbered 207.




Criminal Arrests

Total criminal arrests from **January 21 – February 20, 2008** numbered 16.




Domestic Incidents

Total domestic incidents from **January 21 – February 20, 2008** numbered 3.




Burglary

Total Burglaries from **January 21 – February 20, 2008** numbered 20.




Total juvenile detention / criminal arrests from **January 21 – February 20, 2008** numbered 79.




Traffic Citations

The department issued 90 traffic citations from **January 21 – February 20, 2008**




DUI Arrests

The department made 1 DUI arrests from **January 21 – February 20, 2008**.




Traffic Warnings

The department issued 39 traffic warnings from **January 21 – February 20, 2008**.




Traffic Accidents

From **January 21 – February 20, 2008** police investigated 8 traffic accidents.







The program has been both rewarding to the children and officers.

Press Release

Milton Police on January 25, 2008 arrested Earl Wingila, 34, of Milton, DE for Aggravated Menacing, Possession of a Deadly Weapon During the Commission of a Felony, and Offensive Touching.

Milton Police responded to a residence on Union St in regards to a 911 disconnect. Milton Police upon arrival located the victim standing outside of the residence. Milton Police learned that the victim had ordered Wingila out of the residence and Wingila refused to leave.

Milton Police learned that during the argument Wingila pushed and punched the victim several times. Milton Police learned that Wingila picked up a knife and threatened the victim prior to fleeing the residence.

Milton Police later in the day located Wingila driving down SR5 towards Long Neck and he was taken into custody without incident. Wingila was taken back to Milton Police Department and processed.

Wingila was committed to SCCI in default of \$33,100.00 secured bond pending Court of Common Pleas Preliminary Hearing at a later date.

Milton Police on January 25, 2008 arrested an 11 year old Juvenile from Milton, DE for Felony Theft.

Milton Police were contacted in regards to an 11 year old Juvenile that had removed 3 Apple Macbook laptops valued at approx. \$4,200.00 from a local Elementary School on January 25, 2008.

Milton Police recovered the laptops which were turned over to Administration of the Elementary School.

The juvenile was processed then released to a parent authority of Justice of the Peace Court 2 pending Family Court at a later date.

Milton Police on January 29, 2008 arrested Kenneth Johnson, 49, of Milton, DE for Criminal Impersonation and being a local fugitive (8 times).

Milton Police stopped a vehicle for traffic violations and during the incident Johnson who was a passenger gave false information. Milton Police took Johnson into custody after learning his real name.

Johnson was wanted on 8 outstanding capiases. Milton Police processed Johnson and he was committed to SCCI in default of bond pending future court dates.

The Milton Police Department on February 1, 2008 arrested Richard A. Aiken, 43, of Ellendale, DE for Criminal Impersonation and Local Fugitive.

Milton Police arrested Richard A. Aiken when he provided a false name and date of birth because he was wanted by the Court of Common Pleas. Aiken was processed at Milton Police Department and arraigned via video phone with Justice of the Peace Court 2.

Aiken was released on \$500.00 unsecured bond for the Criminal Impersonation charge and his family paid the fine at Court of Common Pleas.

The Milton Police Department on February 4, 2008 arrested Donald Pike, 49, of Milton, DE for Criminal Mischief.

Milton Police responded to Luther Towers for a criminal mischief complaint to the apartment complex property. Milton Police during the investigation learned that Pike broke the front automatic sliding door to the lobby causing about \$600.00 in damage.

Milton Police obtained a warrant for the arrest of Pike and he was taken into custody without incident. Pike was released on \$500.00 unsecured bond pending a future court date.

The Milton Police Department on February 5, 2008 arrested Arthur Settle, 44, of Milton, DE for Public Intoxication and Disorderly Conduct.

Milton Police responded the area of Federal St and Mulberry St in regards to an intoxicated person laying face down on the sidewalk.

Milton Police took Settle into custody and transported him back to Milton Police Department where he was processed then arraigned via video with Justice of the Peace Court 2.

Settle was committed to SCCI in default of secured bond pending a future court date.

The Milton Police Department on February 8, 2008 arrested Susan Carr, 27, of Milton, DE for Aggravated Harassment.

Milton Police investigated a phone harassment involving Carr calling a family member that has legal custody of Carr's children over 22 times within a short time period yelling and using foul language towards the family member.

Milton Police obtained a warrant for the arrest of Carr and she was taken into custody without incident a short time later. Carr was taken to Milton Police Department and processed.

Carr was arraigned at Justice of the Peace Court 3 and released on \$2,500.00 unsecured bond with a no contact order pending a later court date.

On Feb. 10, 2008, the Milton Police Department arrested Mr. Jeremy R. FOEHNER, 19, of New Market, Maryland, for Rape 2nd, Unlawful Imprisonment 2nd, and Incest. Milton Police had learned

that Accused FOEHNER had sex with victim his 6-year-old half sister in the Milton area sometime during spring of 2007.

Milton Police Department investigated and learned that Accused FOEHNER came over from Maryland, and was visiting his family here in Milton when this sexual assault took place.

Milton Police Department then made contact with the Accused FOEHNER in Maryland area and he turned himself into Milton Police without further incident.

Milton Police Department then interviewed, processed and video arraigned Accused FOEHNER on the charges. Accused FOEHNER was then committed to the Department of Correction in Georgetown, De, on default of \$ 31,000. 00 dollars secure bail.

Case pending in court at a later date.

Milton Police on February 11, 2007 arrested Al F. Correa, 36, of Milford, DE was arrested for Theft (F), and Falsifying Business Records.

Milton Police investigated an internal theft at a local business involving Correa removing U.S. Currency from the register during his work shift and falsifying the records under another line item to hide the theft of U.S. Currency over a period of months.

Correa was processed and released on \$1,500.00 unsecured bond pending a preliminary hearing at CCP at a later date.

Milton Police on February 13, 2007 arrested Robert Fogel for Assault 3rd.

Milton Police investigated an incident on January 25, 2008 involving Fogel and a friend where both assaulted each other. Milton Police arrested the friend Earl Wingila on the 25th and then obtained a warrant for Fogel for assault 3rd after talking with the Department of Justice.

Fogel was processed then released on unsecured bond pending a later Court date.

Milton Police on February 14, 2007 arrested a 15 year old Male Juvenile from Texas for Criminal Mischief, Disorderly Conduct.

Milton Police responded to Food Lion in regards to juveniles being disruptive inside of the store. Milton Police upon arrival learned that the 15 year male juvenile had been throwing a football in the isles and knocked over merchandise damaging the items.

The juvenile when approached by Food Lion management began to argue with the manager and use foul language.

Milton Police arrested the juvenile a short time later and he was released to a relative by Justice of the Peace pending Family Court.

Milton Police on February 16, 2007 arrested Victoria Willis, 23, of Georgetown, DE for Disorderly Conduct.

Milton Police had responded to a fight in progress at Park Royal Apartments on November 24, 2007. Milton Police during the investigation learned that Willis was an active participant in the fight and had fled the scene prior to police arrival.

Milton Police obtained a warrant for the arrest of Willis. Willis was taken into custody on the 16th of February without incident.

Milton Police processed then arraigned Willis with Justice of the Peace Court and Willis was released on \$165.00 cash bond pending a later court date.

Milton Police arrested Jermaine Lambert, 21, of Milton DE for Kidnapping 2nd, Offensive Touching (two counts), Terroristic Threatening, Criminal Mischief, and Breach of Release.

Milton Police were contacted on February 20, 2008 by the victim an ex-girlfriend of Lambert. Milton Police learned that Lambert approached the victim and grabbed the victim by the hair and forced her into his vehicle. Lambert then damaged the victim's cell phone so that she could not call for help. Lambert also damaged the victim's coat by ripping it. Lambert drove to the Rehoboth Beach area and finally released the victim.

Milton Police had arrested Lambert for Offensive Touching and Disorderly Conduct back in October 2007 involving the victim and the charges are still pending with a NO CONTACT ORDER forbidding Lambert to have contact with the victim.

Lambert was taken into custody and committed to SCCI in default of bond pending a preliminary hearing at CCP at a later date.

Milton Police recently investigated a rash of vehicle burglaries with theft and graffiti to property which was widespread over the Town Limits from January 2008 until February 16, 2008.

Milton Police through investigation made arrests involving a 17 year old male juvenile and a 15 year old male juvenile for numerous Burglary, Theft, Criminal Mischief, Graffiti, and Criminal Trespass charges.

Milton Police have on file warrants for the same charges for a 15 year old male juvenile who fled back to the State of Texas and Nelson Torres, 18, of Wilmington De. Milton Police have an additional warrant on file for Torres for Assault 1st, Reckless Endangering 1st and CCDI after he assaulted one of the Co-Defendants in the Milton Public Library.

Milton Police learned that the group or gang of juveniles was linked by graffiti tags along with identified tattoos with a possible gang from the Wilmington DE area along with a gang located in the State of Texas.

The 17 year old and 15 year old male juveniles were committed to Stevenson House in default of bond.

Local Fugitive Arrest

Milton Police on January 23, 2008 arrested Rosa Fernandez, 34, of Milton, DE for being a local fugitive. Fernandez was released by Justice of the Peace Court 3.

Milton Police on January, 27, 2008 arrested Stephanie Francis, 22, of Milton, DE for being a local fugitive out of Court of Common Pleas. Francis was released by Justice of the Peace Court 3 pending CCP.

Milton Police on January 29, 2008 arrested Rose Daisey, 48, of Milton, DE for being a local fugitive. Daisey paid the outstanding fine and was released by Justice of the Peace Court 2.

The Milton Police Department on February 3, 2008 arrested a 17 year old male juvenile for being a Local Fugitive from Justice of the Peace Court 6. The juvenile was released on \$200.00 unsecured bond with a family member co-signing. The juvenile is to appear at Justice of the Peace Court 6 at a later date.

Delaware's Lt. Governor Signs Proclamation to Launch HERO Campaign for Designated Drivers in Delaware

Safety and law enforcement officials also announce details of DE participation in national DUI crackdown

Lewes - Although "It's Good Being First" Office of Highway Safety officials were still exceptionally pleased with Delaware's second place designation on Friday August 17th. That's when Lt. Governor John C. Carney, Jr. signed a proclamation making Delaware the second HERO state in the nation, and OHS announced a new partnership with the New Jersey based HERO campaign to promote designated drivers. The announcement came at a press event held at Delaware State Police Troop 2 in Newark, which also outlined details of Delaware's participation in the National Impaired Driving Crackdown which has just begun.

"Drunk driving is a crime that can all too often turn deadly. Promoting the use of designated drivers is another strong tool we can use to protect the safety of our citizens," said Lt. Governor Carney. "Delaware is already a leader in DUI enforcement and awareness efforts, and incorporating the HERO campaign's message into our strategic plan further strengthens our commitment to stopping impaired driving," said Dept. of Safety and Homeland Security Secretary David B. Mitchell who introduced the Lt. Governor.

The HERO Campaign for Designated Drivers was created by the parents of Naval Ensign John R. Elliott. Ensign Elliott was killed in a head-on collision with a drunken driver just weeks after graduating from the Naval Academy in 2000. On July 22nd of that year, Elliott, who drove from Annapolis, Maryland through Delaware to his home state of New Jersey for his mother's birthday, was struck head on by an impaired driver in Salem County. The driver had been arrested earlier in the evening on DUI charges but was released after posting bail. That driver was also killed. Bill and Muriel Elliott created the HERO campaign in John's honor to end the scourge of drunken driving by celebrating the designated driver as a HERO.

"The *HERO Campaign* is a positive legacy for our son," said Bill Elliott. "At the U.S. Naval Academy John was named the outstanding HERO (Human Education Resource Officer) for

his service to his fellow midshipmen. Now the heroes will be the designated drivers who keep our highways safer in John's memory.”

Delaware OHS officials plan to implement the HERO Campaign by distributing posters and table tents to bars and restaurants and encourage them to provide free non-alcoholic beverages for those who agree to be designated drivers, as well as distribute designated driver pledge cards at sobriety checkpoints and on college campuses. Dover Downs Hotel & Casino implemented the HERO program on their own in 2006 and hope the state's other casino facilities will do the same.

Office of Highway Safety Director Tricia Roberts announced that the sobriety checkpoint conducted Friday evening by Delaware State Police Troop 2, would be dedicated in Ensign Elliott's memory. The dedication is the second in OHS's Dedicated DUI Checkpoint Initiative, which is aimed at remembering the victims of impaired driving, honoring the families who keep their memories alive and demonstrating OHS's and the law enforcement community's dedication to removing drinking drivers from the roads.

“Through this program we hope to remind the public of the tragic consequences of drinking and driving and make it real to them by sharing the story of how ordinary people were taken from us all too soon because of one person's decision to get behind the wheel after drinking,” said Director Roberts.

DUI enforcement in the form of checkpoints and saturation patrols will be stepped up nationwide this week as all 50 states join together for the start of the national impaired driving crackdown, whose slogan is *Drunk Driving. Over the Limit. Under Arrest*. It runs through Labor Day weekend. “One of NHTSA's key initiatives that relate to decreasing alcohol-related traffic fatalities is Sustained, High Visibility Enforcement,” said National Highway Safety Administration (NHTSA) Regional Administrator Dr. Elizabeth Baker at the press event. “Highly publicized and sustained enforcement has the greatest potential for reducing impaired driving crashes. Checkpoints in particular deter impaired driving because they are visible and frequent, and therefore prevent many impaired drivers who might get behind the wheel.”

In Delaware 27 State and law enforcement agencies will conduct DUI saturation patrols for the crackdown in addition to 10 checkpoints scheduled as part of the state's ongoing Checkpoint Strikeforce campaign. *Checkpoint Strikeforce* is the nation's first regional DUI checkpoint campaign. It involves the states of Delaware, Pennsylvania, Maryland, Virginia, West Virginia, and Washington D.C. The Milton Police Chief William E. Phillips has provided the information below to you for educational purposes.

§ 2701. Driving without a license; penalties.

(a) No person shall drive a motor vehicle on a public street or highway of this State without first having been licensed under this chapter, unless expressly exempt from the licensing requirements.

(1) Those students enrolled in an approved Delaware Department of Education driver education course can drive without a learner's permit when under the supervision of a certified driver education teacher.

(2) Failure to adhere to the Level 1 Learner's Permit restrictions under § 2710(c) of this title or temporary instruction permit restrictions under § 2712(a) of this title constitutes a violation of this section. Those motor vehicle operators holding a Level 1 Learner's Permit or temporary instruction permit who violate this section will be suspended for 2 months for the first offense and 4 months for any subsequent offenses.

(b) No person shall drive a motor vehicle on a public street or highway of this State after serving a period of suspension, revocation or license denial, without first having obtained a valid license through proper reinstatement procedures as prescribed by this title.

(c) No person shall drive on a public street or highway of this State a motor vehicle of a class or type for which the person has not been duly licensed.

(d) No person whose license has expired shall drive a motor vehicle on a public street or highway of this State.

(e) Whoever violates subsection (a) or (b) of this section shall for the first offense be fined not less than \$50 nor more than \$200. For each subsequent like offense, the person shall be fined not less than \$100 nor more than \$500 or imprisoned for a term not to exceed 6 months, or both.

(f) Whoever violates subsection (c) or (d) of this section shall for the first offense be fined not less than \$25 nor more than \$100. For each subsequent like offense, the person shall be fined not less than \$50 nor more than \$100. (36 Del. Laws, c. 10, § 51; Code 1935, § 5589; 21 Del. C. 1953, § 2701; 55 Del. Laws, c. 313, § 1; 58 Del. Laws, c. 239, § 51; 61 Del. Laws, c. 343, § 1; 65 Del. Laws, c. 503, § 11; 70 Del. Laws, c. 186, § 1; 71 Del. Laws, c. 282, § 7.)

§ 2703. License to operate a motorcycle, motorbike, etc.

(a) No person shall operate a motorcycle, motorbike or other 2-wheeled or 3-wheeled vehicle having less than 3-foot distance between the adjacent wheels, motor-driven vehicle upon a highway of this State without having been properly licensed and having passed, to the satisfaction of the Department, an examination testing the person's ability to operate such vehicle safely. The Department shall issue a separate license for the operation of such vehicle or shall note on the license authorization to operate the same. Those persons who possess a valid class D operators license or CDL license may operate a 3-wheeled motor vehicle without special endorsements or examinations under § 2713 of this title provided

there is a minimum of 3-foot distance between the adjacent wheels to ensure vehicle stability. A temporary motorcycle instruction permit can be issued to a person age 18 or older after passing a written motorcycle examination. This permit expires in 60 days. If for any reason whatsoever the applicant fails to pass the required road skills examination during the 60-day period granted by the permit, the permit shall be void, and the fee paid therefor shall be forfeited unless the applicant requests an extension thereof and pays the sum of \$2.00. Upon payment of said sum the Division shall immediately issue 1 extension only of the permit for an additional 60 days. If the applicant fails to pass the required examination within the additional 60- day period, the permit shall become void. The following provisions shall apply to a person while operating a motorcycle with a temporary instruction permit for the operation of a motorcycle:

- (1) No passengers shall be allowed on the motorcycle;
- (2) Operating a motorcycle between sunset and sunrise is prohibited;
- (3) A safety helmet and eye protection as approved by the Office of Highway Safety must be worn; and,
- (4) Operation is not permitted on the federal interstate highway system.

(b) The initial fee for the authorization or endorsement as specified in subsection (a) of this section shall be \$8. For each subsequent renewal of an authorization or endorsement the fee shall be \$8.

(c) Of each of the initial fees for authorization or endorsement collected pursuant to subsection (b) of this section the sum of \$5 is appropriated to the Department of Transportation and shall be placed in a special account to be used only for expenses incurred in the administration of the motorcycle rider education program. For each fee collected for subsequent renewals pursuant to subsection (b) of this section, the total of such renewal fee shall also be appropriated to the Department of Transportation to be placed in said special account.

(d) The authorization or endorsement specified in subsection (a) of this section shall not be issued by the Division to any person under the age of 18 years unless the application therefor is signed both by the applicant and by the parent, guardian, court ordered custodian or employer of the applicant with whom the applicant resides in this State.

(1) If the applicant has no parent, guardian, court ordered custodian or employer residing in the State, by some other responsible adult person over the age of 21 who is acceptable to the Secretary of Transportation who resides with the applicant.

(2) The following sponsors are listed in order of priority:

a. Father or mother of the minor, if both parents are living together within this State and the minor resides with both parents;

b. Father of the minor, if the father is living within this State, and the minor resides with the father only; mother of the minor, if the mother is living within this State, and the minor resides with the mother only; or the father or mother, if the father or mother live within this State, and the minor resides with neither parent, and the minor has no legal guardian within this State;

c. Guardian or court ordered custodian of the minor, duly appointed as such under the laws of this State; or

d. Employer of the minor, or any suitable person acceptable to the Secretary of Transportation.

(3) The Department shall not require as a prerequisite to the issuance of a license to a minor under this section, that the father, mother, guardian or court ordered custodian who signs the minor's driver license application be present at the time the application is made by the minor, or sign the application at the offices of the Division of Motor Vehicle. The signing of the application and acknowledgment thereof by the natural parent, guardian, or court ordered custodian before a notary public or other person authorized to administer oaths shall be deemed sufficient to satisfy the requirements of this section. Sponsors designated in subparagraph (2)d. of this subsection shall sign the minor's license application in the presence of a Division representative.

(4) The sponsor who signs the motorcycle endorsement application on behalf of a minor can withdraw their sponsorship at any time until the minor reaches 18 years of age, thereby canceling the minor's authority to drive a motorcycle. If the court terminates the custody order and the minor subsequently resides with a parent in this State, then the parent may cancel the driving privileges of the minor under this section. Once canceled, the applicant can reapply for a motorcycle endorsement when they meet the provisions of this section and pay the endorsement fee.

(5) It shall be unlawful for any person to sign the application of a minor under this section when such application misstates the age of the minor or misrepresents themselves or their relationship to the minor. Any person who violates this provision shall be guilty of a class B misdemeanor. Both the minor applicant and the sponsor's driver's license will be suspended for 2 months under § 2733(a)(5) of this title.

(e) The authorization or endorsement specified in subsection (a) of this section shall not be issued by the Department to any person under the age of 18 years unless such person:

(1) Complies with subsection (d) of this section; and

(2) Completes a motorcycle rider education program, such program having been approved by the State Department of Transportation pursuant to this chapter. (21 Del. C. 1953, § 2702A; 55 Del. Laws, c. 313, § 1; 59 Del. Laws, c. 373, §§ 1, 2; 62 Del. Laws, c. 237, §§ 2, 3; 65 Del. Laws, c. 27, § 2; 65 Del. Laws, c. 356, §§ 1, 2; 70 Del. Laws, c. 186, § 1; 71 Del.
