The annual Holiday House Tour, a cherished Milton tradition, will be held on Saturday, December 8, from 3:00 p.m. until 7:30 p.m., immediately following the Milton Holly Festival.

Showcased this year are two circa 1700's homes, four circa 1800's homes, one mid-1900's home, three new homes, the recently restored 1800's one-room law office of Gov. Hazzard, and the Lydia Cannon Museum. The historic homes include Southern Classical, Colonial, Cottage, and Gothic Victorian architecture. The new homes are Craftsman and Victorian style. The Museum was built in 1857 as a church and features stained glass windows, stamped tin ceiling, and a bell tower.

Inside you will find that every property is stunningly unique and beautifully decorated in holiday splendor. A few of the special features are: homes furnished with period antiques; horsehair plaster walls; intricate parquet wood floors; a home with nine Christmas trees decorated with vintage ornaments; a root cellar; a Victorian Christmas tree; the "Holly Wreath Barn" from which Christmas wreaths were shipped worldwide; a wonderful 1700's "keeping room" with working fireplace.

Come and experience Christmas in the grand tradition in Historic Milton. Most of the homes are within walking distance of downtown Milton. The tour will be held rain or shine.
