Mr. Howard had added that we need to enforce the truck ordinance.

Mrs. Ekellind would like to see whatever it says on the signs is what the ordinance should be and that is what should be enforced, talked about how much time it took to get a truck ordinance and trucks still ride by her house so we need to start enforcing what we have. Mrs. Ekellind agrees with everything Mr. Howard had said.

Councilman West and Mr. Camenisch both agree with the comments that we need to have more parking, need to change the ordinance, need to enforce the ordinance that we already have and add handy cap parking down town. Could add the two spots on the side of the police station for more parking.

ORDINANCE NO. 2014-_____

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE TOWN CODE, CHAPTER 209, ENTITLED
"VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC"

WHEREAS, the Town Charter of the Town of Milton authorizes the Town Council to provide for and preserve the health, cleanliness, ornament, good order and public welfare of the Town, its inhabitants and affairs; and

WHEREAS, the Town Charter of the Town of Milton authorizes the Town Council to regulate, change, and alter the use or prevent the use of any new or present street, lane or alley; and

WHEREAS, Whereas the Town of Milton currently has its Ordinances providing for proper Vehicles and Traffic Policies codified in Town Code Chapter 209; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Milton seeks to amend its enforcement for purposes of parking in the business district and the blocking of driveways;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED, by the Town Council of the Town of Milton, a majority thereof concurring, that the following revisions hereby by incorporated into Chapter 209, Section 26(A) and Section 35(A) of the Town Code as follows:

Section 1. Amend Section 209-26(A) as follows:

No vehicle shall be parked ~~on or across~~ blocking any driveway, either public or private.

Section 2. Amend Section 209-35(A) as follows:

No person shall park any vehicle on the streets of the business district in areas so designated by the State of Delaware or Town Council with a sign for a period of longer than the interval indicated on the sign ~~two hours between the hours of 9:00a.m. and 5:00p.m. at any time.~~

Section 1. Amend Section 209-26 (A) as follows:

No vehicle shall be ~~on or across~~ blocking any driveway, either public or private.

Section 2. Amend Section 209-35 (A) as follows:

No person shall park any vehicle on the streets of the business district in areas so designated by the State of Delaware or Town Council with a sign for a period of longer than the interval indicated on the sign. Two hours between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. at any time.

Adjournment

Mr. Camenisch made a motion to adjourn. Councilman Kost second the motion. Motion to adjourn was approved by unanimous vote after second.
