Helpful Home Security Tips

- Use a timer or photoelectric switch to automatically turn a living room light on at dusk.
- Brightly illuminate all entrances, preferably with vandal proof fixtures.
- Never leave doors or windows unlocked when leaving home.
- Always close and lock garage doors.
- Leave a radio on with the volume turned low when leaving the home - even for short periods.

When Leaving Home for Several Days

- Don't cancel your paper or mail deliveries ask a neighbor to pick them up every day.
- Leave a key with a friend or neighbor; ask them to check the house periodically.
- Leave your car in the driveway; or ask a neighbor to park in it.
- Contact the Milton Police Department to notify them of when you are leaving and when you plan to return; they will check your house periodically.
